Achievements under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana

Will the **Minister of FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING**

- (a) the salient features of Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana;
- (b) the details of funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized by Chhattisgarh during the last three years and the current year, district-wise;
- (c) whether the achievements have been made in consonance with the targets set in this regard; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the steps being taken by the Government to achieve the targets?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING:

(SHRI PARSHOTTAM RUPALA)

- (a) : The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying is implementing a flagship scheme namely “Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY)- A scheme to bring about Blue Revolution through sustainable and responsible development of fisheries sector in India” with highest ever investment of Rs. 20050 crore in the fisheries sector for its implementation for a period of five years with effect from the financial year 2020-21 to 2024-25 in all States/Union Territories(UTs). PMMSY intends to address critical gaps in fish production, productivity, quality, technology, post-harvest infrastructure and management, modernisation and strengthening of value chain, traceability, establishing a robust fisheries management framework and fishers’ welfare. PMMSY eventually aims to enhance fish production and productivity, export, generating employment opportunities, reduction of post-harvest losses and enhancing domestic fish consumption.
- (b) : As reported by Government of Chhattisgarh, the district-wise details of funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized during the last three years and the current financial year is at **Annexure-I**.
- (c) and (d) : Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and dairying has accorded approval for various fisheries development proposals of State of Chhattisgarh at total outlay of Rs. 396.97 crore with a central share of Rs.121.53 crore under PMMSY for fisheries development in the state since the launch PMMSY in 2020-21. Government of Chhattisgarh has reported that the achievements made are in consonance with the activities/components sanctioned under PMMSY during last two years (2020-21 and 2021-22) and the current financial year i.e. 2022-23.
