## Will the **MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the rate of increase in population in the country during the last three year, State-wise;
- (b) whether the Government has launched a policy to control the rapid growth of the population and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the said policy has been able to achieve its aims and objective and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) whether the Government is planning to implement an act to control the rapid growth of the population?

# ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

- (a) As per the Report of the Technical Group on Population Projections, July 2020, the projected population in the country during the last three year, State-wise is placed in "Annexure".
- (b) to(d)The Government accords top priority to the National Family Planning Program, which is guided by the tenets of the National Population Policy 2000 and National Health Policy 2017.

Efforts of the Government have been instrumental in reining in the growth of population, and the following progress has been achieved:

- The Total Fertility Rate (TFR) declined to **2.0 in 2019-20** (NFHS 5) which is below replacement level.
- 31 out of 36 States/ UTs have already achieved replacement level fertility (NFHS 5).
- The **Modern Contraceptive usage** has increased to **56.5%** (NFHS 5).
- The Unmet Need for Family Planning has declined to 9.4% (NFHS 5).
- The Crude Birth Rate (CBR) has declined to 19.5 in 2020 (SRS).

Considering the successes achieved in the family planning programme there is no such proposal for an act to control the growth of the population.
