Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has any action plan for infrastructure development under Swadesh Darshan Scheme in Karnataka;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any steps for the development of rural circuits under the scheme;
- (d) whether the Government has chalked out any plan for development of tourists' spot along the Chennai- Bengaluru- Mumbai corridor and along the Bengaluru-Poona National Highway; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) to (e): Development of tourist spots is primarily responsibility of the concerned State Government/Union Territory (UT) Administration. However, the Ministry of Tourism in the year 2014-15 formulated its 'Swadesh Darshan' scheme under which 76 projects were sanctioned for Rs.5292.57 Crore in the country in different themes. As part of this scheme, two projects were sanctioned under Rural Circuit theme as per the details given below: -

Now the Swadesh Darshan scheme has been revamped by the Ministry as Swadesh Darshan 2.0 (SD2.0) with the objective to develop sustainable and responsible tourism destinations and has identified 'Sindhudurg' in Maharashtra; 'Hampi' and 'Mysuru' in Karnataka and 'Mammallapuram' and 'The Nilgiris' in Tamil Nadu as destinations for development under the scheme.
