SKILL TRAINING UNDER NSDM

513. SHRI CHANDRA SEKHAR SAHU: SHRI RAHUL RAMESH SHEWALE: SHRI GIRISH BHALCHANDRA BAPAT: DR. PRITAM GOPINATHRAO MUNDE:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Union Government has launched National Skill Development Mission (NSDM) for creating convergence across various sectors and States in terms of activities relating to skill training;
- (b) if so, whether the NSDM has fixed any targets for skill trainings;
- (c) if so, the details thereof and the extent to which those targets have so far been achieved, State-wise particularly in Odisha;
- (d) whether there is a need to support weaker and disadvantaged sections of society through focused outreach programmes in the country;
- (e) if so, the details in this regard;
- (f) the details of the steps taken by the Union Government to ensuring high-quality training standards in various States particularly in Odisha; and
- (g) the other measures taken by the Union Government to achieve the goal set under the NSDM?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

(SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

- (a) The National Skill Development Mission (NSDM) was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 15th July, 2015, to provide a strong institutional framework to implement and scale up skill development efforts across the country. Promotion of convergence and co-ordination between skill development efforts of all Central Ministries/Departments/ States/ implementing agencies is one of the objectives of NSDM.
- (b) to (e) Under Skill India Mission, the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skill training through a comprehensive network of skill

development centres/ institutes across the country under various schemes viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme, National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs). All the Skilling schemes of MSDE are purely demand-driven and joining such courses is a voluntary decision on the part of the potential trainee. While it is a fact that no target can be fixed as such for compulsory enrolment of skilling aspirants belonging to the disadvantaged sections under any of the skilling schemes, it has been the endeavour of the Government to ensure that opportunity for skill training is provided to persons belonging to these sections through appropriate provisions in budget for the purpose in relevant schemes. Objectives of NSDM also include support to weaker and disadvantaged sections of society through focused outreach programmes and targeted skill development activities through the Skill Development Schemes of MSDE.

State-wise total number of candidates trained under schemes of MSDE including in the State of Odisha from 2018-19 till December, 2022 is at **Annexure-I**.

- (f) and (g) In order to meet skilling requirement for future workforce, improve the quality of skilling and align the training programs with the changes in the economy and technology to meet the needs of the industry, following steps have been taken by Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE):
 - i. Expansion in infrastructure of Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) through new ITIs in Public and Private Sectors.
 - ii. Upgradation and modernization of ITIs in terms of their infrastructure, pedagogy, curriculum and technology interventions.
- iii. Introduction of new-age courses in Internet of Things (IoT), Renewable Energy, Additive Manufacturing Technology (3-D Printing), Mechatronics, Drone Technology etc in ITIs.
- iv. Launching of the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), for imparting short-term skill training to the youth.
- v. Implementation of JSS to impart Vocational Skills to non-literates, neo-literates and the persons having rudimentary level of education upto 8th standard and school dropouts upto 12th standard in the age group of 15-45 years.
- vi. Notification of common norms for bringing about uniformity and standardization in implementation of various Skill Development schemes by different Central Ministries/ Departments.
- vii. Setting up of Sector Skill Councils (SSCs) as industry-led bodies to develop National Occupation Standards (NOSs).
- viii. Implementation of Skills Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion (SANKALP), an outcome-oriented World Bank supported project for strengthening institutional mechanisms at both national and state levels.
- ix. Implementation of Skills Strengthening for Industrial Value Enhancement (STRIVE) scheme, a World Bank assisted project launched with the objective of improving the relevance and efficiency of skills training provided through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) and apprenticeships.
- x. Mobilisation/outreach activities through Kaushal/Rozgar Melas, Skills Career Counselling Scheme in making skilling aspirational.
- xi. Alignment of courses as per National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF).

- xii. Trainings of Trainers through National Skill Training Institutes (NSTIs) and Institutes of Training of Trainers (IToTs).
- xiii. Launch of National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) to promote apprenticeship training in the country by providing stipend support to the apprentices, undertake capacity building of the apprenticeship ecosystem and provide advocacy assistance to support rapid growth.
