#### **Afforestation Programmes**

#### 5199. SHRI RAJVEER DILER:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the programmes being run by the Government to promote afforestation for environmental conservation and rain water harvesting;
- (b) whether the Government provide any financial assistance to the States for running afforestation programmes and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of the funds allocated and spent under the programmes being run for environmental conservation and afforestation during the last three years and the current year, year-wise; and
- (d) whether the Government proposes to run afforestation programme throughout the country and if so, the details thereof?

#### **ANSWER**

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

The Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change supports the (a) to (d) States/Union Territories for carrying out afforestation activities through Centrally Sponsored Scheme namely National Mission for a Green India (GIM). It aims at protecting, restoring and enhancing India's forest cover and responding to climate change. National Afforestation Programme (NAP) has been the flagship afforestation scheme of the Ministry, implemented since year 2000 on pan India basis, for afforestation in identified degraded forest areas with people's participation and decentralized forest governance. The schemes primarily support environmental conservation and rain water harvesting through afforestation/tree plantation, protection, forest landscape restoration, habitat improvement, soil moisture conservation activities etc. In order to achieve the targeted objectives of National Afforestation Programme, the Ministry has merged NAP into Green India Mission (GIM) so that the overall greening efforts are augmented. The State wise and year-wise details of funds released during last three years (2019-20 to 2021-22) and current year under NAP and GIM is given in Annexure.

Besides, afforestation is a major activity under the Compensatory Afforestation Fund as per the provisions of the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Act, 2016 and the Rules made there under. Further, tree plantation, being a multi-departmental, multi-agency activity, are also taken up cross-sectorally under various programmes/funding sources of other ministries/ organizations and also through State Plan budgets.
