## SALIENT FEATURE OF SAMARTH SCHEME

5324. SHRIMATI JASKAUR MEENA: DR. SANJAY JAISWAL: SHRI TIRATH SINGH RAWAT: SHRI KRIPANATH MALLAH:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES वस्त्र मंत्री be pleased to state :

- (a) the salient features of the "SAMARTH" scheme;
- (b) the details of the funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized under the said scheme in Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand during the last three years and the current year;
- (c) the details of the number of beneficiaries including men/tribal women trained under the said scheme in the aforesaid states during the last three years;
- (d) whether the Government is providing/creating more employment to trained people in textiles and allied sector after imparting training to them under the said scheme;
- (e) if so, the details thereof, State, district-wise and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (f) whether the said scheme is proving to be a boon in rural and remote areas across the country?

## उत्तर ANSWER वस्त्र राज्य मंत्री (**श्रीमती दर्शना जरदोश**) THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR TEXTILES (SMT. DARSHANA JARDOSH)

- (a): Samarth- Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector (SCBTS) has been formulated under the broad skilling policy framework adopted by M/o Skill Development & Entrepreneurship. The objective of the scheme is to provide demand driven, placement oriented National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) compliant skilling programmes to incentivize and supplement the efforts to the industry in creating jobs in the organised textile sector (excluding spinning & weaving) and to provide skilling and skill-upgradation in the traditional textile sectors. A robust digital solution linked with Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS) has been operationalized for implementation and monitoring of skilling programmes under the scheme.
- (b): There is no State-wise allocation of funds under Samarth. The cost of training programme under the scheme is released directly to Implementing Partners. A total of Rs.271.16 crore has been utilized under Samarth across the country including Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand during the last three years and current year.

(c): The details of number of beneficiaries including men/tribal women trained under Samarth scheme in Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand during last three years are given below:

- (d) & (e): Samarth is demand driven scheme to incentivize and supplement the efforts of the industry in creating jobs in the organized textile and related sectors, covering the entire value chain of textiles, excluding Spinning and Weaving in organized sector. In order to ensure placement linkage under the scheme, it is mandated to provide placement to 70% and 90% of trained beneficiaries under entry level courses and upskilling courses respectively for the courses in organized sector by implementing partners. The scheme also aims to address the skilling and skill upgradation requirements in the traditional sectors with the provision of self-employment. State/ district-wise details of beneficiaries provided placement by implementing partners under Samarth scheme is given at Annexure I.
- **(f):** Samarth is implemented on PAN India basis that includes all States and UTs except Ladakh and Lakshadweep. The training is being imparted in large number of districts in each State that includes rural and remote areas benefitting artisans/ workers at that place.
