Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION उपभोक्ता मामले, खाद्य और सार्वजनिक वितरण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the arrangement available for storage of wheat, rice, pulses and other foodgrains in the country at present;
- (b) whether the Government has received complaints of spoilage of foodgrains due to lack of adequate storage facilities;
- (c) if so, the various steps being taken by the Government to make adequate arrangements for storage; and
- (d) the status of the storage in Madhya Pradesh, district-wise?

- (a): Food Corporation of India (FCI) mainly stores wheat & rice after procurement for Public Distribution System (PDS) operation and to maintain buffer stock. As on 01.03.2023, Covered Storage Capacity available with FCI and State agencies for storage of Central Pool foodgrain is 714.82 LMT against stored stock of 321.23 LMT.
- (b) & (c): No, Sir. However, FCI continuously assesses and monitors the storage capacity and based on the storage gap assessment, storage capacities are created/hired through the following schemes: -
 - 1. Private Entrepreneurs Guarantee (PEG) Scheme
 - 2. Central Sector Scheme (CSS)
 - 3. Construction of Silo's under PPP mode
 - 4. Hiring of godown from Central Warehousing Corporation (CWC)/ State Warehousing Corporations (SWCs)/State Agencies
 - 5. Hiring of godown through Private Warehousing Scheme (PWS).
- (d): As per information provided by Madhya Pradesh Warehousing And Logistics Corporation, district-wise storage capacity in Madhya Pradesh State is Annexed.
