MICRO IRRIGATION FUND

706. SHRI SUNIL BABURAO MENDHE: SHRI NIHAL CHAND:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS' WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the objective of the budget announcement made by the Government for micro irrigation fund;
- (b) the manner in which micro irrigation fund is providing facilities to the States to expand micro irrigation in the country and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the steps being taken by the Government to promote the use of micro irrigation among farmers;
- (d) the steps being taken by the Government to increase the awareness among farmers regarding the coverage of Drip Irrigation; and
- (e) the current status of the scheme in States with less water availability like Rajasthan and the comprehensive steps being taken to extend it in the drought-prone areas like Rajasthan where this system may prove to be beneficial?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री (SHRI NARENDRA SINGH TOMAR)

(a) & (b) With a view to providing impetus to the Micro Irrigation systems and to enhance the water use efficiency in agriculture sector, a Micro Irrigation Fund (MIF) with corpus of Rs. 5000 Crore was created with NABARD during 2018-19. The major objective of the Fund is to facilitate the States in mobilizing the resources to provide top up/ additional incentives to farmers for incentivising micro irrigation beyond the assistance available under Per Drop More Crop

(PDMC). States may also access MIF exclusively for innovative integrated projects depending on State specific requirements. Under the MIF, the projects from various States has been approved for Rs. 4710.96 Crore of loan. So far, an amount of Rs. 2174.00 cr has been disbursed to states under MIF. Details of State-wise Projects sanctioned, so far, is available at **Annexure-I**.

Further, to strengthen and expand the adoption of micro-irrigation systems by the farmers in the country, an announcement in Budget- 2021 has been made to augment the initial corpus of MIF by another Rs. 5000 crore.

(c) to (e) In addition to Micro Irrigation Fund (MIF), The Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (DA&FW) is implementing Per Drop More Crop component of Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY-PDMC) from 2015-16 in all the States including Rajasthan and low water availability States of the Country. The PDMC scheme focuses on enhancing water use efficiency at farm level through Micro Irrigation viz. Drip and Sprinkler irrigation systems. The Government provides financial assistance @ 55% for small and marginal farmers and @ 45% for other farmers for installation of Drip and Sprinkler systems under the scheme. In addition, some States provide additional incentives/top-up subsidy for encouraging farmers to adopt Micro Irrigation. So far, under the PDMC scheme, an area of 71.67 lakh ha covered under Micro Irrigation in the Country with Central Assistance of Rs. 17250 crore to the States since 2015-16. The details of coverage of micro irrigation area and Central assistance released to States including State of Rajasthan is at **Annexure-II**.

Farmers are encouraged to take advantage of micro irrigation technologies by wide publicity through press & print media, publication of leaflets/booklets, organization of workshops, exhibitions, farmer fairs, information on State/Government of India web portals etc. In addition, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) imparts training and organizes field demonstrations through Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) to educate farmers for promotion of efficient irrigation techniques/ Micro Irrigation for various crops.
