- (a) the details of the schemes being implemented to upgrade and expand the road network in the country, State and scheme-wise;
- (b) the details of the funds allocated and utilized under the said schemes, State-wise;
- (c) the criteria to convert State Highways (SHs) to National Highways (NHs) in the country;
- (d) the details of the works being carried out for the upgradation of the road network in Rajasthan and aspirational districts of Jharkhand, particularly Palamu and Garhwa during the last three years; and
- (e) the details of the NHs constructed in Rajasthan and Jharkhand during the said period?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) to (e) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 219 ANSWERED ON 03.08.2023 ASKED BY SHRI NARENDRA KUMAR AND SHRI VISHNU DAYAL RAM REGARDING EXPANSION OF ROAD NETWORK

(a) & (b) The Ministry is primarily responsible for development and maintenance of National Highways (NHs). NH network in the country has expanded to about 1,46,145 km at present. State / Union Territory (UT) - wise length of NHs in the country at present is at Annexure-I.

A number of schemes have been implemented by the Ministry for development of NHs in the country such as Bharatmala Pariyojana including subsumed National Highways Development Project (NHDP), Special Accelerated Road Development Programme for North-East Region (SARDP-NE), Special Programme for development of Roads in Left Wing Extremism affected Area (LWE) including Development of Vijayawada-Ranchi Road and Externally Aided Projects (EAP). NHs stretches not covered under any of the above schemes are taken up for development under National Highway Original [NH(O)] works depending upon traffic density, condition of road, inter-se priority and availability of funds. Scheme - wise budgetary outlay (BE) for 2023-24 is as under: -

Apart from the above, National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has targeted for raising Rs. 25,000 Crore through Monetisation of NHs under Infrastructure Investment Trust (InvIT) and Project Based Financing.

Development of NHs works is taken up through executing agencies e.g. National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), National Highways & Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (NHIDCL), Border Roads Organization (BRO), National Highways Logistics

Management Limited (NHLML) and State Governments. Majority of expenditure are incurred by NHAI and NHIDCL. Year-wise details of funds allocated and expenditure incurred / funds released for development of NHs during current year under Schemes / Agencies are placed at Annexure-IIA.

For works being executed through State Governments, State / Union Territory (UT) - wise details of funds allocated and expenditure incurred for development of NHs during current year are placed at Annexure-IIB.

- (c) State roads, including State Highways (SHs), are declared as NHs from time to time on the basis of well established principles. The important criteria for declaration of NHs include the following:
  - i. Roads running through length / breadth of the country.
  - ii. Connecting adjacent countries, National Capitals with State Capitals / mutually the State Capitals, major ports, non-major ports, large industrial centers or tourist centers.
- iii. Roads having important strategic requirement in hilly and isolated area.
- iv. Arterial roads which enable sizeable reduction in travel distance and achieve substantial economic growth.
- v. Roads which help in opening up large tracts of backward area and hilly region.
- vi. Roads contributing towards achievement of National Highways grid of 100 km.
- vii. Synergy with PM GatiShakti National Master Plan (NMP).
- (d) NHs projects in about 1,935 km have been taken up in the State of Rajasthan during the last three years.

NHs projects in about 970 km have been taken up in the State of Jharkhand, including Palamu and Garhwa districts, during the last three years. Out of the above 970km, NHs works in about 160 km has been taken up in Palamu and Garhwa districts.

(e) About 2,262 km length of NHs has been constructed in the State of Rajasthan and 900 km length of NHs in the State of Jharkhand during the last three years. Out of 900km completed length in

Jharkhand, about 45 km has been completed in Palamu and Garhwa districts.
