- (d) the areas in which the Government plans to lay emphasis under the said campaign?

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## STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) TO (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 246 FOR 07.08.2023 ASKED BY SHRI GAJANAN KIRTIKAR AND SHRIMATI DELKAR KALABEN MOHANBHAI, HON'BLE MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT REGARDING EK BHARAT SHRESHTHA BHARAT

(a) to (d) Yes, Sir. The Government has taken a number of initiatives under the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) programme to foster cultural connectivity between people belonging to different States. Under the programme, various activities are carried out in the areas of language learning, culture, traditions and music, tourism and cuisine, sports and sharing of best practices, student exchange etc. to promote sustained engagement amongst the people throughout the country thus enhancing mutual understanding, appreciation and bonding between people of diverse cultures.

The programme employs the unique concept of pairing culturally diverse States/Union Territories (UTs) to promote national integration. The programme embodies 'Whole of Government' approach with more than 10 Ministries of the Government of India including Ministry of Education, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Ministry of Culture, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Ministry of Railways, Ministry of Tourism, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Ministry of AYUSH, Ministry of Women & Child Development, Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Textiles, and Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises participating in its activities.

A special ongoing initiative, focusing on experiential learning and first- hand exposure, called Yuva Sangam (YS) has recently been taken up under the programme with the primary objective of building empathy and strengthening people to people connect between youth of different States/ UTs of India. Under Yuva Sangam, emphasis is laid on providing the youth a multi- dimensional exposure under five broad areas - Paryatan (Tourism), Parampara (Traditions), Pragati (Development), Paraspar Sampark (People-to-people connect) and Prodyogiki (Technology).

As of now, multiple phases of Yuva Sangam (YS) have been completed with 73 tours being conducted between paired States/UTs, with the pairing changing in each phase. Details of the tours under YS is placed at Annexure-I. More than 3,200 people across India have participated in various phases of Yuva Sangam with Maharashtra being covered under all phases, and Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu being covered in the most recent phase.

Besides the above, a one-month long festival called Kashi Tamil Sangamam (KTS) was celebrated under the aegis of EBSB at Varanasi from 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 to 16<sup>th</sup> December, 2022to rediscover and strengthen the ancient intellectual, cultural, spiritual and artisanal connect between these two cultures. The focus of KTS was to rediscover ancient knowledge and integrate it with modern thoughts in the field of philosophy, technology entrepreneurship, craftsmanship etc, which can help us create a valuable body of knowledge culminating in new innovations. 2,550 delegates arrived in Varanasi from Tamil Nadu to attend the KTS.

Similarly, Saurashtra Tamil Sangamam (STS) was conducted during 17th-26th April, 2023. The 10-day confluence saw more than 3000 Saurashtrian Tamils come to Gujarat to rediscover the glorious heritage shared by the two states Tamil Nadu and Gujarat.

The key focus area of the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme is celebrating cultural diversity through mutual interaction and reciprocity between people of different States/UTs so that a common spirit of understanding resonates throughout the country. Going forth, exposure tours under Yuva Sangam will be instrumental in realizing the spirit of EBSB.
