Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION

be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether the Government has proposed to increase the number of existing flights between Delhi and Vadodara;**
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and**
- (c) the number of passengers travelling by different airlines on this air route during the last three years?**

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (GEN. (DR) V. K. SINGH (RETD))

(a) & (b): Vadodara is connected to Delhi by flights of various airlines with 30 departures per week.

With the repeal of the Air Corporation Act in March 1994, Indian domestic aviation market has been deregulated. Airlines are free to select whatever markets and network they wish to service and operate across the country. It is up to the airlines to introduce air services to / from any airport in the country depending upon the traffic demand and their operational and commercial viabilities.;
