Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government agrees with the view that one of the critical aspects of Finland's Technical

and Vocational Education & Training (TVET) system that the country can learn from its strong

collaboration between Educational Institutions, the private sector, and the Government;

(b) if so, the details of the initiatives that are proposed to be taken by the Government to encourage

(a) to (c): National Education Policy 2020 mandates collaboration between secondary Schools with ITIs,

polytechnics, local industry etc. for integration of vocational education with educational offerings of all

secondary schools in a phased manner.

Pandit Sunderlal Sharma Central Institute Of Vocational Education (PSSCIVE), a constituent of

NCERT, develops National Skills Qualification Framework compliant curriculum for vocational subjects in

grades 9 to 12, based on job roles available in National Qualification Register of National Council for

Vocational Education and Training. The Sector Skill Council (SSCs) and other stakeholders in the

Vocational Education and Training (VET) system, including industry representatives, are responsible for

developing Qualification Files for the job roles in various Sectors. The Curriculum is developed from the

National Occupational Standards (NOS) given in the Qualifications File (QF) of the job role. The Learning

Outcome based curriculum for vocational subjects is developed to align with industry requirements and

provide students with the necessary skills and knowledge for successful careers in their chosen fields.
