#### Status of Teachers for Class I to VIII

### 1719. SHRIMATI MANJULATA MANDAL: SHRI RAVIKUMAR D.:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of school teachers sanctioned by each State including Odisha for classes 1 to 8 for the years 2020, 2021 and 2022;
- (b) the total number of positions for teachers for classes 1-8 that have been filled in above mentioned years;
- (c) the total number of teacher vacancies for classes 1-8 for the years 2020, 2021 and 2022 and the reasons for not filling up these vacancies;
- (d) the total number of schools closed under merger/consolidation/rationalisation in each State especially in Odisha; and
- (e) whether the children from such schools are admitted in other schools and the measures that were taken by the Government so that affected children continue their education?

#### ANSWER

## MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SMT. ANNPURNA DEVI)

(a) to (c): The total number of sanctioned, in-position and vacant teaching positions in each State including Odisha for classes 1 to 8 for the years 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 is given at ANNEXURE.

Education is a subject in the concurrent list of the Constitution and a majority of the schools are under the administrative control of respective State Governments/Union Territory administrations. Recruitment of teachers, their service conditions including the monitoring of absence and deployment come under the purview of the respective State Governments and Union Territory administrations. Recruitment is a continuous process and vacancies keep arising due to a number of factors like retirement, resignation, increased requirement of teachers as a result of the enhanced students' strength. However, the Ministry of Education requests the State and UT Governments for filling-up the vacant posts of teachers and their rational deployment, through review meetings and advisories from time to time.

- (d): The data regarding number of schools closed under merger/consolidation/rationalization in each State especially in Odisha is maintained by the respective State/Union Territory Government. The Government of Odisha has consolidated 5697 satellite schools with lead schools.
- (e): The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 provides children's access to elementary schools within the defined area or limits of neighbourhood. In pursuance of Section 6 of the RTE Act, all States have notified area or limits of their neighbourhood norms. In addition, Section 8 of the RTE Act, 2009 also mandates that the appropriate government shall provide free and compulsory elementary education to every child and will ensure availability of neighbourhood schools.

Under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Samagra Shiksha, States are supported for ensuring access of all children affected due to consolidation/rationalization of schools to a fully functional neighbourhood school and to consolidate the resources to improve quality of education and to ensure retention. Transport/escort facilities for these children are also supported.
