Will the Minister of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship be pleased to state:

- (a) Whether the scheme of affording Dividend under Make in India Programme has been implemented in all the States/UTs;
- (b) If so, the number of the youth covered under the scheme for the grant of Dividend under the said during the last three years; and
- (c) The number of youth particularly from the district of Prayagraj having been benefitted from the scheme so far?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) Make in India initiative was launched on September 25, 2014, to facilitate investment, foster investment, foster innovation, building best in class infrastructure, and making India a hub for manufacturing, design and innovation. The development of a robust manufacturing sector continues to be a key priority of the Indian Government. Since its launch, Make in India initiative has made significant achievements and presently focuses on 27 sectors under Make in India 2.0. The activities under the Make in India initiative are also being undertaken by several Central Government Ministries/Departments and various State Governments.

To support realisation of objectives of Make in India and to reap the benefits of demographic dividend, there is a focus on equipping youth with employable skills so that they can contribute substantively to the economic growth of country. Under Skill India Mission, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) delivers skilling, re-skilling and up-skilling training through various schemes viz. Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Sikhshan Sansthan (JSS), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all the sections of the society across the country.

Total number of persons trained under the above mentioned schemes during the last three years scheme-wise and number of persons trained in Prayagraj is given in the table below:
