GAPS IN SUPPLY CHAIN INFRASTRUCTURE

1857. SHRI DILESHWAR KAMAIT:

Will the Minister of **FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES** be pleased to state:

- (a) the manner in which Government is going to plug existing gaps in food processing supply chain infrastructure vis-a-vis inadequate primary processing, storage and distribution facilities;
- (b) whether the Government has developed a road map or strategy to incentivise the food processing sector and promote the creation of Make-in-India internationally recognized food/beverage brands; and
- (c) the status of implementation of Mega Food Parks/Cold Chain facilities in the country, particularly in the State of Punjab?

ANSWER

(a) & (b):- In order to ensure overall development of Food Processing Industries including to plug gaps in supply chain infrastructure, primary processing, storage and distribution facilities, Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) has been incentivizing setting up/expansion of related infrastructure through its Central Sector Umbrella Scheme Pradhan Mantri Kisan SAMPADA Yojana (PMKSY), Production Linked Incentive Scheme for Food Processing Industry (PLISFPI) and Centrally sponsored PM Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) scheme across the country.

Under component schemes of PMKSY, MoFPI provides mostly credit linked financial assistance (capital subsidy) in the form of grants-in-aid to entrepreneurs for setting up/ expansion of food processing / preservation industries.

Ministry also provides financial, technical and business support for setting up/upgradation of food processing enterprises through credit linked subsidy under PMFME scheme with an outlay of Rs.10,000 crores during five years from 2020-21 to 2024-25.

PLISFPI is, inter alia, intended to support creation of global food manufacturing champions and support Indian brands of food products in international market. The Scheme is being implemented over a six-year period from 2021-22 to 2026-27 with an outlay of Rs. 10,900 crores.

(c): So far, a total of 41 Mega Food Park have been approved for assistance in the country under component schemes of PMKSY, out of this 24 Mega Food Park have been made operational. A total of 382 Integrated Cold Chain projects have been approved for assistance across the country under component schemes of PMKSY, out of this 283 projects have been completed. The details of Mega Food Parks and cold chain projects approved under corresponding schemes of PMKSY in Punjab is placed in **Annexure**.
