Will the **PRIME MINISTER** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the National Centre for Good Governance (NCGG) is expanding its capacity to train more civil servants from different countries with a rise in demand for its programmes such as those in public policy and governance and if so, the details thereof till date along with the funds sanctioned/spent till now, year-wise;
- (b) whether the NCGG has imparted training to civil servants from other countries and if so, the details thereof, country-wise;
- (c) whether NCGG is expanding capacity to train more foreign officers and if so, the details and present status thereof along with the funds sanctioned/ spent till now, year-wise; and
- (d) the steps being taken by the Government to set up such regional offices/branches of NCGG in the country including Andhra Pradesh and Telangana?

ANSWER

(a): Yes Sir. National Centre for Good Governance (NCGG) has been training civil servants from different countries. The funds sanctioned/spent till now on training of civil servants of different countries, year-wise is as follows:

- (c): In the year 2023-24, 45 international capacity building programmes for training 1750 international civil servants have been planned. Ministry of External Affairs(MEA) has sanctioned an amount of Rs. 17,60,26,500/- for the capacity building of 1425 international civil servants from Bangladesh, Cambodia, Mauritius, Sri-Lanka, Myanmar, Gambia, multi-country courses for African Countries, Forum for India-Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC)/ Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA), Latin American Countries (LAC) region including one e-Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) course on "special programme on emerging governance practices".
- (d): NCGG has a branch office functioning at Mussoorie, Uttarakhand. There is no proposal for setting up regional offices/branches of NCGG in the country.
