**Development Programmes in the Vicinity of Coal Mines**

- the impact of said development programmes on the socio-economic condition of the people living in the vicinity of the said coal mines?

(a) &(b) The details of development programmes launched in the vicinity of coal mines in the country undertaken by Coal India Limited (CIL), Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) and Neyveli Lignite Corporation India Limited are given below:

**1. Coal India Limited (CIL)**

Coal India Limited (CIL) and its subsidiaries undertake development programmes in the peripheral areas of its coal mines through their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds. As per CSR policy of CIL, at least 80% of the CSR funds every year have to be spent within a radius of 25 kms., of mines/project sites/establishments by subsidiaries of CIL. The key areas covered are Healthcare & Nutrition, Sanitation & Water Supply, Education & Livelihood, Rural Development, Environmental Sustainability and Disaster Management, in addition to Women Empowerment and Welfare of the Differently-Abled Persons.

During the last five financial years, a total of Rs. 2,659.41 cr. have been spent under CSR by CIL and its subsidiaries, details of which are furnished below:

## 2. Neyveli Lignite Corporation India Limited(NLCIL)

The details of the various CSR projects undertaken by NLCIL in the vicinity of coal mines are placed at **Annexure**.

Besides, NLCIL organizes various Skill Development programs and provides varied short term and long term skill training for the beneficiaries. The people residing in and around its project sites also benefited under the schemes. The various programs undertaken at NLCIL are Apprenticeship Training programs, Short Term Skill Training (STT) Programs, Industrial Training Institute (ITI), Skill Development initiatives in collaboration with Academic Institutions. NLCIL has also established the ‘Rajeev Gandhi Industrial Training Institute (RGITI)’ at its project site in Barsingsar, Rajasthan and at Talabira Coal Mines, Odisha for residential education & overall Skill Development for children belonging to the ST category at Kalinga Institute of Social Studies (KISS), Bhubaneswar

## 3. Singareni Collieries Company Limited(SCCL)

SCCL has adopted the CSR policy in the year 2014 and integrated its economic activity with the social concerns. SCCL have been executing many CSR projects in the operational areas / vicinity of coal mines from the year 2014 to 2023. The budget sanctioned for development projects under CSR from the year 2014 to 2023 (till 28.07.2023) is ₹326.36 Crores. The major thrust areas identified for this purpose are as;

- i. Basic Services (Drinking water supply, Sanitation etc.,)
- ii. Health
- iii. Education
- iv. Livelihood and Local Economic Development
- v. Intervention from marginalised communities such as SCs and STs
