PROBLEM OF TELECOM CONNECTIVITY

†2184. SHRI DEVJI M. PATEL:

Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) the steps taken to address the problem of telecom connectivity in Rajasthan including Jalore and Sirohi; and

(b) the State-wise and district-wise number of the mobile towers set up during the last three years?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI DEVUSINH CHAUHAN)

(a) & (b) Government and Telecom Service Providers (TSPs) provide the telecom connectivity in the Country in a phased manner including Rajasthan. As per data provided by Telecom Service Providers (TSPs), Department of Telecom field units and State Governments as of March 2022, out of 6,44,131 villages in the country (as per RGI data of November 2019), 6,05,230 villages are covered with Mobile internet connectivity. In the state of Rajasthan, there are 46,077 villages, out of which 42,761 (as of March 2022) are covered with mobile connectivity.

Government through funding from Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF) is implementing various schemes for providing telecom connectivity to all uncovered villages of the country including Rajasthan. In Rajasthan, total 1,709 4G towers (including upgradation from 2G/3G to 4G) have been planned, including 16 towers in Jalore district and 37 towers in Sirohi district under the 4G saturation project of USOF.

Further, 51 4G towers have also been planned in Rajasthan under other schemes of USOF.

The state-wise and district-wise (Rajasthan State) number of the BTS set up during the last three years are attached as **Annexure-I** and **Annexure-II**.
