TEXTILES MANUFACTURING HUB

2201. SHRI DAYANIDHI MARAN:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES वस्त्र मंत्री
be pleased to state :

- (a) whether the PM MITRA Textile Park in Amravati will strengthen the progress of Maharashtra, if so, the details along with the specific contributions of Maharashtra across the entire textile value chain that made it a choice for a textile park;
- (b) the details of the role of the Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC) in the establishment of the PM MITRA Park;
- (c) whether the establishment of the PM MITRA Park in Amravati will make India a global textiles manufacturing hub, if so, the details along with the investment expected for the PM MITRA Textile Park in Amravati;
- (d) the details of the direct and indirect employment opportunities will be created by the establishment of the PM MITRA Park;
- (e) whether the existing infrastructure is already available in the brownfield park, such as roads, water and electricity, if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) whether the Government have any plan/ proposal for new parks in Tamil Nadu and if so, the details thereof?

(a) to (e): Under PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Park (PM MITRA) Scheme, 7 Mega Integrated Textile Parks will be set up under Greenfield/Brownfield categories including one at Amravati, Maharashtra. The integrated textile manufacturing envisaged in the park will help in reducing logistics cost and improve overall competitiveness of Indian textiles in global market. Once completed it is envisaged that each park will lead to investment of about Rs. 10,000 crore and creation of about 1 lakh direct and 2 lakh indirect jobs, which will benefit the local economy and textile ecosystem. Maharashtra has a well-developed textile ecosystem, abundant raw material i.e. cotton, excellent logistics and attractive policies.

PM MITRA Parks were selected on the basis of proposals received from State Governments having ready availability of contiguous and encumbrance-free land parcel of minimum 1,000 acres and other supporting factors including road connectivity, existing textile ecosystem and industrial infrastructure. While greenfield sites were fresh sites proposed by the State Governments, brownfield sites proposed were either partially developed sites with some infrastructure available or extension of already existing park sites with possibility of sharing of certain common infrastructure. In respect of Maharashtra, the State Government has proposed extended part of existing MIDC park as brownfield park under PM MITRA Scheme.

(f): Under the PM MITRA Scheme, the Government has finalised 7 sites including one from Tamil Nadu at Virudhnagar.
