### PER CAPITA INCOME

#### 2245. SHRI KALYAN BANERJEE:

Will the Minister of STATISTICS AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION be pleased to State:

- (a) whether India's per capita Net National Income (NNI) in real terms, increased by about 35 percent from Rs.72,805 in 2014-15 to Rs.98,118 in 2022-23;
- (b) if so, whether Government plans was to double the NNI by 2015;
- (c) the details of inflation rate since 2014-15 and the growth in per capita income during each year; and
- (d) the report of price research organisation on annual income of 'Poor Income' data base in terms of inflation rates during the last eight years?

#### **ANSWER**

(a): Yes sir. As per latest provisional estimate published on 31st May, 2023, India's per capita Net National Income (NNI) at constant (2011-

- 12) prices increased by 35.12 percent from Rs. 72,805 in 2014-15 to Rs. 98,374 in 2022-23.
- (b): Government had not planned to double the NNI by 2015.
- (c): The all India Financial Year wise Average Inflation Rate based on all India Consumer Price Index and the growth in per capita income during 2014-15 to 2022-23 is given below:
