## **USAGE OF DRY TOILETS AT AIRPORTS**

### Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION नागर विमानन मंत्री

be pleased to state:-

(a) whether the dry toilets are being used at Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport, Mumbai resulting in saving of approximately one lakh litres of water on a daily basis;

(b) the total number of airports including international airports in the country facilitating dry toilets and promoting other methods for water conservation;

(c) whether the Government proposes to install dry toilets at all the airports across the country;

(d) if so, the details thereof and the time by which these are likely to be installed; and

(e) if not, the reasons therefor?

### ANSWER

(a) to (e): There are 148 operational Airports/ Heliports/ Water Aerodromes in the country, out of which only Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport, Mumbai, is using dry toilets, resulting in saving of approximately 3.3 lac litre of water daily. A few other airports have tried installing dry toilets/urinals, but these attempts proved unsuccessful mainly due to the lingering odour and blockage issues due to deposition of salts.
