2674. SHRI ARVIND DHARMAPURI:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the funds allocated to Telangana under the Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY) of National Health Mission since 2019 onwards alongwith the expenditure reported by the State Government thereunder;
- (b) the number of institutional deliveries registered under the scheme along with the ranking of various States therein in the country, State/UT-wise since 2019, including district-wise in Telangana;
- (c) whether there is a provision of financial aid in cash to the pregnant women of all BPL/Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes categories on having institutional delivery in private and Government hospitals under JSY;
- (d) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise; and
- (e) whether there is any provision for financial aid to such pregnant women in case of delivery at home and if so, the details thereof particularly in Telangana?

(a) Under National Health Mission (NHM), the funds allocation for the Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY) is done as part of RCH Flexible Pool. Details of approvals given to the State of Telangana under JSY since FY 2019-20 is given in the table below:

(b) The State- wise details of the number of institutional deliveries (number of JSY Beneficiaries) under the scheme in the country are given at **ANNEXURE-1**. The district-wise details of the number of institutional deliveries is maintained at the State level. The State- wise details of total institutional deliveries including Telangana as per NFHS-5 (2019-21) is given at **ANNEXURE-2**.

(c) to (e) Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY) implemented under the National Health Mission (NHM) is a safe motherhood intervention promoting institutional delivery among pregnant women especially with weak socio-economic status i.e. women from Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and BPL households.

The details of eligibility and cash aid/ financial assistance under JSY in rural and urban areas for States/UTs including Telangana is as follows:

| Low Performing States (LPS)* | 500 | 500 | Available only to BPL women (regardless of age and number of children) who prefer to deliver at home. |
| High Performing States (HPS)** | 500 | 500 | |

* Low Performing States (LPS) are the States/UTs which have low institutional delivery rates, namely, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

** High Performing States (HPS) are the remaining States/UTs where the levels of institutional delivery are satisfactory.
