**ALLOCATION OF FUNDS UNDER NATIONAL DIGITAL HEALTH MISSION**

**2732. SHRI NARENDRA KUMAR:**

Will the Minister of **HEALTH and FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the funds allocated for Rajasthan under National Digital Health Mission, district-wise;
- (b) whether the digital health cards have been distributed to all citizens in Rajasthan;
- (c) if so, the details thereof, district-wise; and
- (d) the details of the proposal submitted by the State Government for issuing digital health cards along with the action taken thereon?

**ANSWER**

**(a) to (d)**

Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) (earlier known as National Digital Health Mission) aims to create a platform enabling interoperability of health data within health ecosystem to create longitudinal Electronic Health Record (EHR) for every citizen.

Under ABDM, a Central Sector Scheme, funding for human resources, capacity building & Information Education and Communication (IEC) activities has been earmarked for all the States and Union Territories (UTs) in the country. Rs 14.41 Cr has been allocated to Rajasthan under ABDM so far.

The Ayushman Bharat Health Account (ABHA) number is a randomly generated 14-digit number, which uniquely identifies an individual participating in India's digital healthcare ecosystem. This aims to ensure that the created medical records are linked to the correct individual or are accessed by healthcare provider through appropriate consent.

As on 28<sup>th</sup> July 2023, a total of 2,17,88,807 Ayushman Bharat Health Accounts (ABHAs) have been generated in Rajasthan. The district wise details are at Annexure.
