**Assessment of Education of Children with Disabilities**

2762. SHRI RAJESHBHAI CHUDASAMA:  
MS. DEBASREE CHAUDHURI:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has conducted any assessment regarding the education of children with disabilities;
- (b) if so, the details of percentage of the such children who are currently studying, State/ UT-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has adequate number of trained teachers to provide education to children with disabilities and children with special needs;
- (d) whether the Government is providing any satellite based online education for these children, if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the steps being taken by the Government to provide maximum opportunity for education to the children with disabilities?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (e) The Ministry of Education is implementing the Samagra Shiksha – an integrated scheme for School Education, under which children with special needs from Pre-Primary to Class XII, as per Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 are covered. As per UDISE 2021-22, the Children with Special Needs (CWSN) enrolment (Class I to XII), is 0.88% of total enrolled children. The State & UT-wise enrolment of CWSN in percentage is at **Annexure-I**.

Under Samagra Shiksha scheme, the inclusive education component provides for Student specific interventions, upto Rs.3,500 per CwSN per annum which includes (i) Provision of aids and appliances, (ii) Access to and development of teaching learning material as per requirement etc. (iii) Provision of facilities like transport/escort facilities for children with severe disabilities, assistive devices, support staff (readers, amanuensis) etc. (iv) Provision of large print text book, Braille books (v) Provision of home based education for children with severe &/ multiple disabilities.

Further, Support for CWSN girl students is provided @ Rs.200 per month for 10 months to encourage their participation in the school system. Identification and assessment camps of children with disabilities at block level under which support is given upto Rs.10,000 per camp for identification of children with disabilities. Equipping Block Resource Centres (BRCs) by providing support upto Rs.2.00 lakh per BRC (once in 5 years) with equipments & Teaching Learning Materials for individualised learning support for CwSN.

The scheme also provides for engagement of Special Educators who may be posted at the block or cluster level as per the requirement and can operate in an itinerant mode, covering a group of schools where children with special needs are enrolled so that each child with special needs is adequately covered.

The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has proactively taken many initiatives to promote the accessibility of education such as: **PRASHAST** - A Disability Screening Checklist for Schools - a mobile app that covers the 21 disabilities, including the benchmark disabilities as per the RPwD Act 2016, has been developed for early screening and identification of children with disabilities at the school level. **Barkhaa** Series is a supplementary 'Graded Reading Series' formulated with the objective of enabling children to develop reading skills during the early years, as a pedagogic tool aimed at helping the children of Classes I and II in learning to read with meaning and to arouse in them the urge to read more and more. **Teaching Learning Resources in Indian Sign Language** - This initiative realizes and promotes inclusion of students with Hearing Impairment in mainstream education. More than 935 Universal Design of Learning (UDL) based textbook videos, prepared by NCERT are available on DIKSHA along with 10,500 ISL dictionary words. **Audio Books** - The textbook is available in e Pub talking book format which can be read through Text to Speech (TTS) app and also in audio format, using drama and sound of animals, picture description etc. are developed with the aim to enhance accessibility for Children with Visual Impairment (CwVI) and also for realizing the need of anytime and anywhere access. **PMeVIDYA** - Under PM eVidya, 12 DTH channels (one class, one channel) initiative many live programs are broadcast daily to facilitate students' learning through leveraging the ICT solutions. One of the live series is "Teaching Learning Interventions for Inclusive Classrooms". Each episode is of half an hour duration with a mandatory ISL interpreter. More than 594 episodes worth 297 hours broadcast time are available as archive on NCERT official YouTube channel.
