- (a) the salient features of the Jan Shikshan Sansthan Scheme;
- (b) the details of funds sanctioned/allocated and utilized during each of the last three years and the current year in Rajasthan under the said scheme;
- (c) the details of the institutes being operated under the said scheme and the courses conducted therein;
- (d) whether the Government is contemplating including new courses under the said scheme;
- (e) if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the number of SC/ST students enrolled and trained in Rajasthan under the said scheme along with the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION

(SMT. ANNPURNA DEVI)

(a) The Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship is implementing the Scheme of Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) through the agencies to impart skill training to non-literates, neoliterates, persons with rudimentary level of education, and school dropouts up to 12th class in the age group of 15-45 years in rural areas and urban slums. The priority groups are women, SC, ST, minorities and other backward sections of the society. The objective of the scheme is to increase household income by promoting self/wage employment through Skill Development training.

The salient features of the Jan Shikshan Sansthan are,

(i) Low-cost, flexible and highly accessible skill training to Women, Scheduled Caste (SC),
Scheduled Tribe (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBCs), minorities and any other disadvantaged groups of society.

- *(ii)* Activities to create awareness in the community on important issues such as social, economic, health, financial literacy and environment etc.
- *(iii)* NSQF aligned courses suitable for self-employment and wage employment through local demand skilling.
- (*iv*) Digital Literacy and employability skills are also incorporated in the course curriculum.

(b) The JSS Scheme is central sector scheme and, hence, centrally managed, no funds is released directly to the States, the details of Grant-in-aid released to the JSSs in Rajasthan is at <u>Annexure-I</u>.

(c) The Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme is implemented through registered Societies (NGOs) with 100% grant from the Government of India. At present, 288 JSSs are functional across in 26 States and 7 UTs including 8 JSSs in Rajasthan. These JSSs impart skill training in 50 Job roles in 23 sectors details of which are at <u>Annexure-II</u>.

(d) & (e) The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship has developed 15 NSQF (National Skills Qualification Framework) aligned courses relevant to the JSS beneficiaries in FY 2022-23. In addition to this, 35 NSQF courses have also been adopted for imparting training in JSSs. The list of courses offered under the JSS scheme is at Annexure-II.

(f) The number of SC/ST students enrolled and trained by the JSSs in Rajasthan is at Annexure -III.
