Will the Minister of **Education** be pleased to state :

(a) whether a large number of young men and women with Higher Education degree have to be provided alternative employment through Skill Development training under the scheme for Higher Education Youth in Apprenticeship and Skills (SHREYAS);

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the names of the schools where the said scheme has been implemented in Chhattisgarh during the last two years and the current year; district-wise;

(d) the number of trained young men/women beneficiaries under the said scheme;

(e) the amount allocated by the Government for the said scheme during the said period; year-wise; and

(f) whether the State Government is implementing the scheme efficiently or any irregularities have been detected in this regard; and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) to (f): There is no such approved scheme named Scheme for Higher Education Youth in Apprenticeship and Skills (SHREYAS) in this Ministry.

In order to augment the demand of skilled manpower in the industrial activities and with a view to impart tangible skills-in-demand, Government of India enacted National Apprentice Training Scheme. Its execution done through four Regional Boards located at Chennai, Kanpur, Mumbai and Kolkata respectively. A total 2,68,012 apprentices have been trained and Rs 400 cr has been released in the year 2022-2023.
