PROGRESS OF PMGSY

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the progress of Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in terms of completed rural road projects and their length during each of the last four years, State and district-wise particularly in North Eastern States and Satara, Solapur and Latur districts of Maharashtra;**
- (b) the notable benefits and improvements in rural connectivity achieved through the implementation of PMGSY, State and district-wise particularly in North Eastern States and Madha Lok Sabha and Latur district of Maharashtra;**
- (c) whether there are any specific challenges faced during the execution of PMGSY and if so, the details thereof, State and district-wise particularly in North Eastern States and Satara, Solapur and Latur districts of Maharashtra and the manner in which they were addressed;**
- (d) the funds allocated, utilized and that which remained unspent, if any, under PMGSY, State and district-wise particularly in North Eastern States and Satara, Solapur and Latur districts of Maharashtra;**
- (e) the manner in which the Ministry is ensuring efficient resource utilization; and**
- (f) the future plans of the Ministry to further enhance rural connectivity in Satara, Solapur and Latur districts through PMGSY in the coming years?**

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a) & (b) The State-wise details (including North-Eastern States and Maharashtra) of road projects completed during last four years are given in Annexure-I.

The implementation of Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) has resulted in all-weather road connectivity to unconnected habitations as per the programme guidelines, facilitated easy access to market places, growth centres, schools and hospitals in rural areas and also generated employment in various forms. It has helped in improving socio-economic condition of people living around the PMGSY roads and created a positive impact at household as well as community level.

The details of road length constructed State-wise, district-wise and year-wise under various interventions of PMGSY may be accessed at the programme website [omms.nic.in=>progress monitoring=>Financial Year wise Achievement](http://omms.nic.in=>progress%20monitoring=>Financial%20Year%20wise%20Achievement).

(c) While implementing the scheme, challenges like issues of land acquisition, forest clearance, court cases, lack of response to tenders, law and order issues, financial capability of states to release funds, execution capacity of States, timely availability of the construction

materials such as gravel, moorum, sand, stone aggregate bitumen, machinery, personnel to handle machinery etc. came in the way which impacted the progress of the scheme in certain locations. For North-Eastern and hill states, some additional issues like adverse climatic conditions, tough terrain, short working season etc. also have been reported for PMGSY sites.

The Ministry of Rural Development has taken a number of initiatives such as regular review /special review meetings/monthly review meetings by Secretary/Additional Secretary/Joint Secretary, Ministry of Rural Development with Chief Secretaries/Principal Secretaries of the States, review of forest and wildlife clearance at various levels, hand-holding of the States for capacity building and technology dissemination etc. to facilitate implementation of the programme. Further measures such as amendment in Operational Manual of the PMGSY for early commencement of work on ground, launch of Vision Document on New Technology Initiatives & Guidelines-2022 etc. to overcome construction issues have been taken to address the challenges faced in completion of the sanctioned works within the time-line prescribed in the programme guidelines.

(d) Central funds under PMGSY are released to State Governments and funds are released at district and sub-district level by the State Governments. The State-wise details of Central fund released, expenditure and unspent balance under PMGSY during last four years and current year as on 04.08.2023 is given in the Annexure – II. The details of expenditure incurred in the Districts of NE States and Satara, Solapur and Latur districts of Maharashtra during last four years is given in the Annexure – III.

(e) As per the programme guidelines of Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), the execution of works under the scheme is the responsibility of the State Government concerned.

Ministry is satisfactorily ensuring resource management through National Rural Infrastructure Development Agency (NRIDA) starting from project appraisal to till completion of the project. Regular progress monitoring, checking quality of roads by National Quality Monitors (NQMs) and electronic maintenance of the roads under Defect Liability Period (DLP) are also being done periodically. NRIDA is mandated to extend technical and management support to the Ministry of Rural Development in implementation of PMGSY for efficient utilization of the resources.

(f) All eligible unconnected habitations in Latur, Satara and Solapur districts of Maharashtra have already been provided connectivity. The details of eligible habitations sanctioned and connected in Latur, Satara and Solapur districts of Maharashtra are given as below:
