## **FARMER ISSUES**

3056. SHRI DIBYENDU ADHIKARI:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the agricultural sector faces several issues such as low growth, high incidence of indebtedness among farmers, high cost of inputs, fragmented land holdings and a lack of capital investments;
- (b) if so, the action taken by the Government for utilization of 100 per cent funds for the welfare schemes therefor; and
- (c) the proposal of the Government to increase average monthly income of every agricultural household from Rs. 10,218 to Rs. 20,000 by 2025 thereof?

## **ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE

(a) to (c): Agriculture is a state subject. However, Government of India is actively supporting and supplementing efforts of state governments by implementing a comprehensive range of central sector and centrally sponsored schemes including Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH), Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY), Bhartiya Prakritik Krishi Paddhati (BPKP) under Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojna (PKVY) and Per Drop More Crop (PDMC). As a result, during the last 6 years the agriculture and allied sector has been growing at a record 4.4% per annum, as per Economic Survey 2023-24,. The efforts of Government in positive implementation of these schemes have yielded remarkable results

towards improving agricultural productivity, growth and augmenting the income of the farmers. Between 2013-14 and 2022-23, increase in productivity has been 17.95% for food grains, 23.65% for pulses and 35.2% for coarse cereals. Also, there is increase in the production of food grains by 6.5 times, oilseeds by 7.9 times, cotton by 11.6 times and sugarcane by 8.6 times are the successful examples of innovation lead agricultural development in the country. In recent years, unprecedented increase in pulses production to 27.5 MT and increasing production trend in oil seed crops (41 MT) are glaring evidences of our technological innovations and their adoption by the farmers.

The Government has launched many schemes/programmes to increase income of farmers:
