WORKS UNDER JJM IN UTTAR PRADESH

3599. DR. MAHESH SHARMA:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any work is being carried out under Har Ghar Jal/Nal se Jal yojana under Jal Jeeven Mission (JJM) in Gautam Buddh Nagar and Bulandshahr districts of Uttar Pradesh;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the current status and the funds allocated;
- (c) the number of houses in which drinking water connections have been provided under JJM in Uttar Pradesh including the number of persons benefited thereby, district-wise;
- (d) the number of drinking water connections in the said districts under JJM; and
- (e) the details of the households which are still deprived of drinking water connections in the said districts under JJM?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE OF JAL SHAKTI

(SHRI PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

(a) to (e) Since August 2019, Government of India is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) in partnership with States to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household by 2024. In respect of Uttar Pradesh, the JJM is being implemented in all 75 districts of the State including Gautam Buddh Nagar and Bulandshahr.

At the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission, in Uttar Pradesh, 5.16 Lakh rural households were reported to have tap water connections. Since then, around 142.53 Lakh additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections in the State. Thus, as on 08.08.2023, out of 262.49 Lakh rural households in the State, around 147.69 Lakh (56.27%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes.

Government of India maintains the data of tap water connections in terms of rural households. The district wise number of rural households provided with tap water supply in Uttar Pradesh, is at **Annex.**

In Gautam Buddh Nagar district of Uttar Pradesh, as on 15 August 2019, 1,246 rural households were reported to have tap water connections. Since then, around 0.36 Lakh additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections in the district. Thus, as on 08.08.2023, out of 0.44 Lakh rural households in the district, around 0.37 Lakh (85%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes and 0.07 Lakh households are yet to be provided tap connections.

Similarly, in Bulandshahr district of Uttar Pradesh, as on 15 August 2019, 0.21 Lakhs rural households were reported to have tap water connections. Since then, 3.24 Lakhs additional rural households have been provided with tap water connections in the district. Thus, as on 08.08.2023, out of 4.59 Lakhs rural households in the district, around 3.45 (75%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes and 1.14 Lakhs households are yet to be provided tap connections.

Under JJM, this Department releases funds to States/ UTs only. Further, district-wise fund allocations are made and maintained by State/ UT only and not by this department. The details of Central fund allocated and fund drawn by the State of Uttar Pradesh during the last four years and current year, is as under:
