SUPPLY OF UNDERWEIGHT LPG CYLINDERS

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether cases of irregularities with respect to pilferage or supply of underweight cylinders have reduced during the last three years;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) the steps taken by the Government to prevent pilferage/supply of underweight cylinders to LPG consumers;
- (d) whether the Government is taking necessary steps to make the complaint redressal mechanisms accessible in cases of irregularities relating to pilferage/ supply of underweight cylinders; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) to (e) Yes Sir. Public Sector Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) have reported that the established cases of irregularities against distributors regarding pilferage or supply of underweight cylinders have come down from 39 in 2020-21 to 28 in 2022-23.

OMCs have taken various steps to prevent pilferage/supply of underweight cylinders to LPG consumers, which inter-alia include, automatic filling of cylinders at bottling plants, sealing of cylinders with Tamper Evident Seal, Statistical Quality Control on 10 % cylinders received from bottling plant, pre-delivery checks and weighment of cylinders, carrying portable weighting scales by delivery persons, random checks by OMC officials at go-down/delivery points/en-route, organizing public awareness campaigns etc.

In all established cases of irregularities, action is taken against the LPG distributorships as per the relevant provisions of Marketing Discipline Guidelines (MDG) and Distributorship agreement.
