Guidelines for Teachers and Educational Institutes

†658. SHRI CHUNNI LAL SAHU:

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has prepared any action plan to lay down the standards for teachers and
- educational institutions in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the standards laid down by the Government for teachers and educational institutions; and
- (d) the restrictions imposed by the Government on teachers and educational institutions for not

fulfilling the prescribed standards?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SMT. ANNPURNA DEVI)

(a) to (d): As mandated under para 5.20 of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the task for

developing National Professional Standards for Teachers (NPST) has been assigned to the National

Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) and NCTE has prepared an NPST guiding document based

on the inputs/suggestions from various stakeholders. NCTE has introduced Performance Appraisal

Report (PAR) from academic session 2020-21 to ascertain the fulfilment of norms and standards by

the Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs) as prescribed by NCTE.

Also, in view of para 8.7 of NEP 2020, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has been

designated to act as Standard Setting Authority for KVs and JNVs. Accordingly, CBSE has

prepared standards in different areas of school functioning like curriculum, pedagogy, assessment,

infrastructure, inclusive practices, human resources, management and governance, and leadership.

The 'Assessment Tool' for the framework of standards called School Quality Assessment and

Assurance (SQAA) has also been developed and made available on CBSE website and the

DIKSHA portal. SQAA framework has been developed as a guideline for schools to rate

themselves against set standards and effect improvement wherever required. No restriction has been

placed on schools for not meeting the standards.
