SKILL DEVELOPMENT IN CAPITAL GOODS INDUSTRY

Will the Minister of **HEAVY INDUSTRIES** भारी उद्योग मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Union Government has made investment for skill development of employees in the capital goods industry under the Scheme for Enhancement of Competitiveness in the Capital Goods Sector Phase-II in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise particularly in Odisha and Maharashtra;
- (c) the details of the programmes and the curricula put to use in various States particularly in Odisha and Maharashtra; and
- (d) the number of individuals trained under the scheme so far during the year 2022-23, Statewise particularly in Odisha and Maharashtra?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR HEAVY INDUSTRIES (SHRI KRISHAN PAL GURJAR)

- (a): Yes, several initiatives for skill development have been taken by Ministry of Heavy Industries (MHI) under the Scheme for Enhancement of Competitiveness in the Capital Goods Sector Phase II.
- (b): Scheme for "Enhancement of Competitiveness in the Indian Capital Goods Sector- Phase-II" is a pan India, demand driven scheme, in which projects have been sanctioned across India. The state wise list of projects sanctioned for promotion of skilling are as under:
