STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) to (e) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *276 (16th POSITION) FOR ANSWER ON 21.12.2023 REGARDING REDEVELOPMENT OF GOVERNMENT COLONIES

(a) to (e) : Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has redeveloped Government colonies of New Moti Bagh & East Kidwai Nagar in Delhi. Government through National Building Construction **Corporation (NBCC) and Central Public Works Department (CPWD) is** General Residential redeveloping 07 (seven) more Pool Accommodation (GPRA) colonies namely Kasturaba Nagar, Mohammadpur, Sriniwaspuri, Thyagraj Nagar, Nauroji Nagar, Netaji Nagar and Sarojini Nagar in Delhi. Two of these colonies Mohammadpur and Thyagraj Nagar have been re-developed and These projects are being executed on self-sustainable allotted. finance model wherein the cost of the construction is to be met from the sale of commercial built-up area (BUA) at Nauroji Nagar and parts of Sarojini Nagar. The total estimated cost of redevelopment of these 07 GPRA colonies is Rs. 32,835 crores. There are a large number of GPRAs in Delhi. Some of these colonies have old houses and offer good potential for re-development on self sustainable finance model.
