Will the Minister of *Ayush* be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the fund sanctioned and utilized by the Government under the AYURSWASTHYA Yojana during the year 2022-2023, State/UT-wise including Rajasthan and Jharkhand;
- (b) the details of the scheme along with its components showcasing the notable achievements and the goals realized;

- (c) the details regarding the outline of the specific strategies employed under the scheme and Public Health component to promote AYUSH interventions in community healthcare;
- (d) the details of the research and development activities fostered by utilizing the fund under the Centre of Excellence component along with the outcomes/advancements that have been observed so far;
- (e) the steps taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to ensure the accessibility of AYUSH healthcare services in remote/underserved areas under the National AYUSH Mission;
- (f) the details of AYUSH Entrepreneurship Programme and its contribution towards promoting the AYUSH sector alongwith the support mechanisms in place for aspiring entrepreneurs; and
- (g) the details as to how the AYUSH Wellness Centres initiative including CTRI, RMIS, SAHI, AMAR, e-Medha portals etc. complements the AYURSWASTHYA Yojana's objectives along with its role in advancing AYUSH principles and practices in the country?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF AYUSH (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

(a & b) Central Sector Scheme, of AYURSWASTHYA Yojana under Ministry of Ayush has its two components viz (i) AYUSH and Public Health (PHI) (ii) Centre of Excellence (CoE). The AYURSWASTHYA Yojana is being implemented w.e.f. Financial Year 2021-22. The fund allocated for AYURSWASTHYA Yojana during the FY 2022-23 was 27.83 Cr at RE stage and 11.00 Cr at BE stage. The details of funds sanctioned to the orgnization under Ayurswasthya Yojana during the FY 2022-23 State/UT-wise including Rajasthan are placed at Annexure – I. No fund was released to Jharkhand State during the FY 2022-23. Total 17 projects are supported for FY 2022-23 under the scheme and a fund to the tune of Rs.10.83 crore was released to different organizations. The project under AYURSWASTHYA Yojana are approved for three years.

- (c). The detail strategies employed under the scheme and public health components for inviting application, sanctioning of project, fund released pattern and monitoring pattern / assessment criteria are available at https://main.ayush.gov.in/schemes-2/central-sector-scheme/ayurswasthya-yojana/
- (d) the details of the research and development activities fostered by utilizing the fund under the Centre of Excellence component along with the outcomes / advancements that have been observed so far are placed at **Annexure-II**
- (e) Under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National Ayush Mission (NAM) has provision of financial assistance to State Govt. for setting up of 50 /30/10 bedded integrated Ayush hospitals as well as Ayush Dispensaries, upgradation of standalone Government Ayush hospitals & dispensaries, Co-location of Ayush facilities at Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs) & District Hospitals (DHs) and operationalization of Ayush Health & Wellness Centres (Ayush HWCs) for providing Ayush treatment and medicines.
- (f) Ministry of Ayush signed a MoU with Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME) for the promotion of Ayush enterprises. In this regard, 10 Awareness programmes on Digital Advertisement, E-Marketing, GST&GeM were organized and 07 National Seminar / Workshop on Packaging, Marketing and Export Promotion of Ayush Products were organized by the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME).

Under the mandate of the Ministry of Ayush, An Incubation Centre AIIA-iCAINE has been set up at All India Institute of Ayurveda, New Delhi to Support Ayush-related Start-ups and Entrepreneurs. AIIA-iCAINE has provided Mentorship and various clinical facilities to the startups at AIIA, New Delhi.

(g) CTRI portal facilitates researcher for conducting clinical trials in India. CCRAS has developed four Indian Medical Heritage based applications, (i) AYUSH Manuscripts Advanced Repository (AMAR) (ii) Showcase of Ayurveda Historical Imprints (SAHI) Portal (iii) e-Medical Heritage Accession (e-Medha) Catalogue (iv) Research Information Management System (RMIS). These portals and Ayush Wellness Centres are not linked to AYURSWASTHYA Yojana.
