**JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN IN BIHAR**

139. SHRI KAUSHALENDRA KUMAR:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) established in Bihar;
- (b) the details of the number of trained employees and other staff on the said centres, centre-wise; and
- (c) the details of the contributions made by the Jan Shikshan Sansthan to the states.

**ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

(SHRI RAJEEV CHANDRASEKHAR)

(a) The Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme, initially launched as Shramik Vidyapeeth (SVP) in 1967, aims to provide skill training in a non-formal mode at the doorsteps of the beneficiary through registered Societies (NGOs) with 100% grant from the Government of India. The target beneficiaries of the scheme are non-literates, neo-literates and persons having rudimentary level of education, school dropouts up to class 12<sup>th</sup> in the age group of 15-45 years. At present, there are 21 JSSs in the State of Bihar. The list of these JSSs is given at **Annexure-I.**

(b) The details of the number of employees and other staff(s) in JSSs in Bihar are given at **Annexure-II.**

(c) The JSS Scheme provide skill training in a non-formal mode at the doorsteps of the beneficiary to women, Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBCs), minorities and any other disadvantaged groups of society. The target beneficiaries of the scheme are non-literates, neo-literates and persons having rudimentary level of education, school dropouts up to class 12<sup>th</sup> in the age group of 15-45 years. The scheme aims to increase the household income by promoting self/wage employment through skill development training. In addition, the Livelihood Cells are also setup under the JSSs for the promotion of livelihood opportunities and formation of Self Help Groups (SHGs) to promote entrepreneurship.

Further, the JSSs also contribute by conducting activities to create awareness in the community on important issues such as social, economic, health, financial literacy and environment etc. JSSs actively participate in celebrating multiple events like Yoga Day, Independence Day, Swachhata Pakhwada, World Environment Day etc.

Since 2018 till 15th October, 2023, a total of 1,36,192 beneficiaries have been trained in Bihar under this scheme. The year wise, gender wise and category wise details of the trained beneficiaries are given at **Annexure-III.**
