# LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 1450 ANSWERED ON 12/12/2023

#### **PMGSY PHASES**

### 1450. SHRI CHANDRA PRAKASH CHOUDHARY: SHRI R.K. SINGH PATEL:

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features of the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY);
- (b) the number of projects and roads sanctioned under PMGSY
  Phases I, II and III separately in the country during the last five
  years and the current year, State-wise particularly Jharkhand
  and Uttar Pradesh including Giridih Parliamentary Constituency;
- (c) the total funds sanctioned, allocated and utilized by the State in this regard during the said period, State-wise;
- (d) the achievements made so far along with the details of pending works and the time by which the pending works are likely to be completed, Statewise;
- (e) whether any time limit has been fixed for the completion of roads and if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the steps being taken by the Government for the construction of roads to connect the far-flung areas and the underdeveloped parts of Jharkhand and Tribal areas of Uttar Pradesh?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a) Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) was launched as a one-time special intervention to provide rural connectivity, by way of a single all-weather road, to the eligible unconnected habitations of designated population size (500+ in plain areas and 250+ in North-Eastern States, Himalayan States, Desert and Tribal Areas as per 2001 census) in the core network for uplifting the socio-economic condition

of the rural population. In the critical Left Wing Extremism affected blocks (as identified by Ministry of Home Affairs), additional relaxation has been given to connect habitations with population of 100 persons and above (2001 census). As the programme unfolded a need was felt for consolidation of the existing Rural road Network to improve its efficiency not only as a provider of transportation services but also as a vehicle for social and economic development. Accordingly, in the year 2013, PMGSY-II was launched for upgradation of selected through Routes and Major Rural Link with a target to upgrade 50,000 km in various states and Union Territories. In the year 2019, Government launched PMGSY-III for consolidation of 1,25,000 km Through Routes and Major Rural Links connecting inter-alia, to Gramin Agriculture Market(GrAMs), higher secondary Schools and Hospitals.

#### **Salient Features of PMGSY**

- Decentralized, evidence based planning
- Standards and specifications as per Indian Road Congress (IRC) and Rural Roads Manual
- Dedicated Implementation Mechanism: National Rural Infrastructure Development Agency (NRIDA), State Rural Road Development Agency (SRRDA) and Project Implementation Units (PIUs)
- Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) scrutiny by State Technical Agencies, Principal Technical Agencies and NRIDA
- Strong IT backbone for monitoring and implementation (Online Management, Monitoring and Accounting System (OMMAS), Government e-Procurement System of NIC (GEPNIC), Electronic Maintenance of Rural Roads under PMGSY (eMARG), Geographic Information System (GIS) applications)
- Three-tier Quality Management System
- Grievance Redressal Mechanism (Meri Sadak App)
- Unbroken flow of funds
- 5 year inbuilt maintenance included with performance guarantee of contractor
- (b) Parliamentary constituency-wise data is not maintained within the Ministry. There are three districts within Giridih Parliamentary Constituency viz. Giridih, Bokaro and Dhanbad. The roads work sanctioned during the last five years and the current year, State-wise particularly Jharkhand and Uttar Pradesh including Giridih, Bokaro and Dhanbad districts; is given in Annexure-I.

- (c) The allocation/release of funds to the States for implementation of PMGSY is done on the basis of the proposal received from the State and depends, inter-alia, on works in hand, execution capacity of the State and unspent funds available with it. The details of Central share released and expenditure incurred (including State share) to the States/UTs is given in Annexure-II.
- (d)&(e) The achievements made so far along with the details of pending works, State-wise; is given in Annexure–III. The timeline for completion of PMGSY-I & II is March, 2024 and for PMGSY-III is March 2025.
- (f) Under PMGSY-I, habitations with population (census, 2001) of 500+ in plain areas and 250+ in North-East and Himalayan States, Desert areas, Tribal (Schedule V) areas and 88 Selected Tribal and Backward districts (as identified by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) were eligible for providing connectivity. In addition to above to ensure improved road connectivity under PMGSY for most remote and tribal areas, additional relaxation has been given to connect habitations with population 100 to 249 persons in Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected blocks as identified by the MHA.

Details of habitations sanctioned, completed and balance under 250+ and 100-249 category in the State of Jharkhand and Uttar Pradesh are as under:-
