## STEEL EXPORT

1762. SHRI NIHAL CHAND:

Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

- (a) the total volume of Steel produced in the country during the last two years including its share in global production;
- (b) the present domestic demand for Steel and the share of the country in the total global steel exports; and
- (c) the effective measures taken by the Government to make the country top most producer of Steel at the global level during the last three years?

(a) Data on the production of crude steel in the country in the last two years and its share in the world production are given below:

- (c) Steel is a deregulated sector and the decisions related to steel production, domestic consumption and export are taken by the individual steel producers on the basis of market demand and other commercial considerations. However, the Government has taken the following steps in the last three (3) years to create a conducive environment for entire steel sector: -
  - Notification of Steel Quality Control Orders to prevent the manufacturing and import of non-standardized steel and to make available quality steel products to the public at large.
  - ii. Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for specialty steel to promote the manufacturing of 'Specialty Steel' within the country.
  - iii. Adjustments in Basic Customs Duty on steel products and raw materials along with calibration of trade remedial measures like Anti-dumping duty (ADD) and Countervailing Duty (CVD) on certain steel products to enhance the competitiveness of India's steel sector.
  - iv. Engagement with potential users like Railways, Defence, Petroleum and Natural Gas, Housing, Civil Aviation, Road Transport and Highways, Agriculture and Rural Development sectors to enhance the steel usage in the infrastructure, housing & manufacturing sectors and boost overall demand for steel in the country.
  - v. Engagement with various stakeholders including industry associations and leaders of the domestic steel industry to address their issues by the concerned Ministries/ Departments of the Central Government and State Governments.

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
