1941. SHRI A. GANESHAMURTHI:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the steps taken by the Government to promote MSME industries and implementation of various schemes in the country during the last four years, State/UT-wise, especially in Tamil Nadu;
- (b) the current status of projects being incubated under 'A Scheme for Promotion of Innovation, Rural Industries and Entrepreneurship' (ASPIRE) in Tamil Nadu;
- (c) the number of beneficiaries trained, employed on wage basis and self-employed under the said scheme, State/UT-wise; and
- (d) the details and list of incubation centres in Tamil Nadu along with their achievements scheme-wise?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI BHANU PRATAP SINGH VERMA)

- (a): The Government implements various schemes, programmes and initiatives for the promotion, development and enhancing the competiveness of Micro Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME) in the country **including in the State of Tamil Nadu**. Schemes of the Ministry of MSME are Central Sector Schemes, where funds are not allocated State/UT-wise. During the last four years, a number of initiatives have been taken to promote the MSME sector in the country including in the State of Tamil Nadu, which inter alia include the following.
 - (i) Rs. 5 lakh crore Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme for business, including MSMEs.
 - (ii) Rs. 50,000 crore equity infusion through Self Reliant India Fund.
 - (iii) Revised criteria for classification of MSMEs to promote investment.
 - (iv) No global tenders for procurement up to Rs. 200 crores.
 - (v) "Udyam Registration" for MSMEs, for Ease of Doing Business w.e.f. 01.07.2020.
 - (vi) Launching of an online Portal "Champions" in June, 2020 to cover many aspects of e-governance including redressing grievances and handholding of MSMEs.
 - (vii) Inclusion of Retail and Wholesale traders as MSMEs on 02.07.2021.
 - (viii) Non-tax benefits extended for 3 years in case of an upward change in status of MSMEs.
 - (ix) Roll out of Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP) programme with an outlay of Rs. 6,000 crore over 5 years.
 - (x) Launch of Udyam Assist Platform (UAP) on 11.01.2023 to bring the Informal Micro Enterprises (IMEs) under the formal ambit for availing the benefit under Priority Sector Lending (PSL).
 - (xi) As announced in Budget 2023-24, Rs. 9,000 crore has been infused in the corpus of CGTMSE to enable additional credit of Rs. 2 lakh crore with a reduced cost of credit.
- (b) to (d): Under the Scheme, 'A Scheme for Promotion of Innovation, Rural Industries and Entrepreneurship' (ASPIRE), as on 05.12.2023,a total of six Livelihood Business Incubators (LBIs) and one Technology Business Incubator (TBI) have been approved in the State of Tamil Nadu. Details of the LBIs and TBI in the State of Tamil Nadu along with the achievements and status of projects are given at **Annexure-I.**

State/UT-wise number of beneficiaries trained, employed on wage basis, self-employed under the ASPIRE scheme are given at **Annexure-II.**
