Action on Shortage of AYUSH Doctors

2293. SHRI B.B. PATIL

Will the Minister of AYUSH be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is an acute shortage of AYUSH doctors in the country and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the number of various posts including doctors/specialists lying vacant at present in AYUSH hospitals/dispensaries/wellness centres in the country particularly in metro cities, State/UT-wise;
- (c) the measures taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to fill up the said posts; and
- (d) the other measures taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to reduce the shortage of doctors and other staff to meet the requirements in the country?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF AYUSH (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

- (a) No, Sir.
- (b) to (d) As Public Health is a State subject, the number of posts including that of doctors/specialists lying vacant at present in AYUSH hospitals/dispensaries/wellness centres in the country particularly in metro cities is maintained by the State/UT Governments. Further, the primary responsibility to fill up the posts of doctors/specialists also comes under the purview of respective State/UT Governments. However, under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National Ayush Mission (NAM), the components for setting up of upto 50/30/10 bedded integrated Ayush Hospitals, upgradation of exclusive standalone Ayush Hospitals inter-alia are having provision for contractual deployment of AYUSH Doctors. In this regard, State/UT Governments are required to submit their proposals through State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) as per the guidelines of the scheme.
