2303. SHRI GAJANAN KIRTIKAR: SHRI ASHOK KUMAR RAWAT: SHRI KRUPAL BALAJI TUMANE:

Will the Minister of CORPORATE AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether various undertakings under the Ministry have allocated funds under Corporate Social Responsibility during the last four years and in the current financial year;
- (b) if so, the details of the funds allocated and utilized specifically in Scheduled Caste (SC) dominated areas along with the number of beneficiaries areawise/undertaking-wise/district-wise and item-wise;
- (c) whether funds are spent under CSR especially in backward and SC dominated areas in the country;
- (d) whether there is a need to take effective steps to spend the fund under CSR especially in backward and SC dominated areas in the country;
- (e) if so, whether it is proposed to include SC dominated areas in Maharashtra and Misrikh constituency of Uttar Pradesh under it; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) to (c): There is no undertakings under this Ministry and there is no provision of allocation of funds under CSR framework. The broad framework for Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) has been provided under Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act'), Schedule VII of the Act and Companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014. All data related to CSR filed by companies in MCA21 registry is available in public domain and can be accessed at www.csr.gov.in. However, the present CSR filing does not capture the beneficiary-wise details of the CSR projects of the companies.

On the basis of the filings made by the companies in the MCA21 registry, State-wise and development sector wise details of CSR spent by Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) during last four Financial Years (FY) i.e 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 are at Annexure –I & II respectively. Further, the companies are required to file CSR details for FY 2022-23 on or before 31.03.2024.

(d) to (f): Schedule VII of the Act enlist the list of eligible CSR activities which can be undertaken. The activities mentioned under Schedule VII are broadly aligned with national priorities and related to inclusive and sustainable development such as health, education, poverty eradication, hunger, women empowerment, welfare of armed forces veterans, environment, sports, rural development, slum area development, welfare of weaker sections, disaster management etc. Further, entries in Schedule VII are broadbased and must be interpreted liberally so as to capture the essence of the subjects enumerated therein. As such socially, economically and educationally backward areas of the country are also intended to be important beneficiaries of CSR spending.

Under the Act, CSR is a Board driven process and the Board of the company is empowered to plan, decide, execute and monitor CSR activities based on the recommendations of its CSR committee. The Government does not issue any directions to the companies to spend in particular area or activity. On the basis of filings made by the companies in the MCA 21 registry, companies have spent an amount of Rs. 1022.46 crores in aspirational districts as identified by NITI Aayog in FY 2021-22 (data up to 31.03.2023) as against Rs. 651.43 crores in FY 2020-21.
