**BLACK SPOTS ON NATIONAL HIGHWAYS**

**3054. SHRI KESINENI SRINIVAS:**

**Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS**

**be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether it is a fact that Vijayawada is ranked thirteenth in terms of the number of deaths caused by road accidents in 2022;**
- (b) if so, the details thereof;**
- (c) the number of black spots that have been identified on National Highways (NHs) passing through Andhra Pradesh, district-wise;**
- (d) the details of the steps taken to rectify black spots and mitigate road accidents in the State, especially in the NTR district;**
- (e) the details of the length of NHs in Andhra Pradesh that have undergone Road Safety Audits before the issue of completion certificate of the project; and**
- (f) the details of measures taken to establish and maintain quality Trauma Care Centres along the NHs in the State?**

**ANSWER**

**THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS**

**(a) and (b) Ministry publishes Report on "Road Accidents in India" annually based on data received from Police Departments of States/ UTs. As per the Report, 2022, number of fatalities for the million-plus cities including Vijayawada during year 2022 is attached as Annexure - I.**

**(c) and (d) A total of 466 black spots have been identified on National Highways in the State of Andhra Pradesh based on accidents data for the period 2016-2018. District-wise details is annexed at Annexure- II. Out of the 466 black spots, short term rectification work has been completed in all Black spots and Long term rectification work has been completed on 404 Black Spots.**

**(e) Road Safety Audit is mandatory before issuance of provisional certificate/completion certificate for National Highways. Accordingly, Road Safety Audits were carried out before the issuance of Provisional Certificate/Completion Certificate for 36 nos. of projects for a length of 802 Km since FY 2020-21 under the jurisdiction of MoRTH in Andhra Pradesh State. Further, Road Safety Audits were carried out before the issuance of Provisional Certificate/Completion Certificate for 20 nos. of projects for a length of 1048 Km under the jurisdiction of NHAI in Andhra Pradesh State.**

**(f) Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India has taken initiatives towards setting up of Trauma Care Facilities (TCFs) along the National Highways in the country under “National Programme for Prevention and Management of Trauma and Burn Injuries”. During 11th Five Year Plan (2007-2012) and 12th Five Year Plan (2012-2017), a total of 196 Trauma Care Facilities (TCFs) were sanctioned in Government Hospitals/ Medical Colleges across the country, out of which 14 were sanctioned in Andhra Pradesh.**
