Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of various interventions under the Jal Shakti Abhiyaan Catch the Rain Campaign;
- (b) the details of works related to reviving traditional water bodies that have been completed in Pratapgarh, Deoria of Uttar Pradesh, Balasore of Odisha, and Pali Parliamentary constituency of Rajasthan during the last two years;
- (c) whether the programme also carried out watershed development works in the said parliamentary constituencies:
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) the details of intensive afforestation works carried out in the said parliamentary constituencies; and
- (f) the details of the expenditure incurred for completion of all works under the programme during the last two years?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI

(SHRI BISHWESWAR TUDU)

- (a) Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain (JSA:CTR) campaign has five focused interventions- (1) rainwater harvesting & water conservation (2) enumerating, geo-tagging & making inventory of all water bodies; preparation of scientific plans for water conservation (3) setting up Jal Shakti Kendras in all districts (4) intensive afforestation and (5) awareness generation.
- (b) Under JSA: CTR campaign, Parliamentary Constituency-wise data is not maintained. The JSA: CTR portal (jsactr.mowr.gov.in) has provisions for collection and compilation of district-wise details of works undertaken by all the districts across the country. JSA: CTR has one focused intervention of rainwater harvesting & water conservation which inter-alia includes renovation of traditional water bodies. The details of works related to renovation of traditional water bodies completed during the last two years under the campaign in Pratapgarh, Deoria of Uttar Pradesh, Balasore of Odisha and Pali district of Rajasthan is at **Annexure I**.
- (c) to (e) As per information available on JSA: CTR portal (jsactr.mowr.gov.in), the details of watershed development & intensive afforestation works completed under JSA: CTR in the districts of Pratapgarh, Deoria, Balasore and Pali is at Annexure II.
- (f) Funds spent under the JSA: CTR Campaigns is inter-sectoral convergence of various development programmes/ schemes of Central and State Governments. However, financial assistance of Rs. 2.00 lakh is released to each district for GIS mapping of water bodies and preparation of scientific water conservation plans under JSA: CTR. The state-wise details of funds released under JSA: CTR for GIS mapping of water bodies and preparation of district water conservation plans is at **Annexure III.**
