Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the schemes launched by the Government to increase agricultural production in the country during the last five years;
- (b) whether the Government has recently approved any such scheme for implementation in the country including Odisha;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of potential benefits to farmers due to the implementation of the above schemes in Odisha, district-wise; and
- (e) the details of funds transferred to the farmers through DBT under various schemes in Odisha, district-wise?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री (SHRI NARENDRA SINGH TOMAR)

- (a) to (d): Government of India is implementing a comprehensive range of schemes and programmes for the welfare of farmers in the country. These schemes and programmes are applicable to all states/UTs including Odisha and encompass entire spectrum of agriculture including credit, insurance, income support, infrastructure, crops including horticulture, seeds, mechanization, marketing, organic and natural farming, farmer collectives, irrigation, extension, procurement of crops from farmers at minimum support prices, digital agriculture etc. A brief of major schemes/initiatives launched by the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare in recent years is given in the **Annexure-I.**
- (e): Major central sector schemes like Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) and Modified Interest Subvention Scheme (MISS) are entitlement based and in respect of centrally

sponsored schemes, beneficiaries are selected by state governments and district wise beneficiary details are not available. However, income support under PM-KISAN is transferred into the bank accounts of farmers' families across the country, through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode, the district-wise details for Odisha are given in **Annexure-II.** Year wise details of allocation and release under centrally sponsored schemes for Odisha are given in **Annexure-III.**

PMFBY was launched in 2016 in order to provide a simple and affordable crop insurance product to ensure comprehensive risk cover for crops to farmers against all non-preventable natural risks from pre-sowing to post-harvest and to provide adequate claim amount. The scheme is demand driven and available for all farmers A total of 5549.40 lakh farmer applications were insured under the scheme since 2016-17. Total Rs 150589.10 crore has been paid as claim.

In Odisha, as on 31.10.2023, 366.3 lakh farmer applications insured and Rs 6,686.4 crore paid as claims under this scheme.

Interest Subvention
 Scheme (ISS) & Kisan
 Credit Credit Card
 Saturation Drive

The Interest Subvention Scheme (ISS) provides concessional short term agri-loans to the farmers practicing crop husbandry and other allied activities like animal husbandry, dairying and fisheries. ISS is available to farmers availing short term crop loans upto Rs.3.00 lakh at an interest rate of 7% per annum for one year. Additional 3% subvention is also given to the farmers for prompt and timely repayment of loans thus reducing the effective rate of interest to 4% per annum. The benefit of ISS is also available for post-harvest loans against Negotiable Warehouse Receipts (NWRs) on crop loans for a further period of six months post-harvest to small and marginal farmers having Kisan Credit Cards (KCCs), on occurrence of natural calamities and severe natural calamities.

Under KCC saturation drive announced in 2020.

As on 03-11-2023, 1126037 KCC applications sanctioned in Odisha.
