## PLI SCHEME FOR TEXTILES

## 498. SHRI CHANDRA SEKHAR SAHU: DR. PRITAM GOPINATHRAO MUNDE: SHRI RAHUL RAMESH SHEWALE:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES वस्त्र मंत्री be pleased to state :

(a) whether despite being a significant player in the textiles and apparel industry, India has been unable to make a sizable mark in a sub segment man-made fibres;

(b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor;

(c) the details of the response received towards performance linked incentive (PLI) scheme for textiles from various States, particularly Odisha and Maharashtra;

(d) whether the Government has extended the date of inviting fresh applications under PLI scheme for textiles of man-made fibre apparel, fabrics and products of technical textiles;

(e) if so, the details thereof along with the response received from three States;

(f) whether man-made fibre industry is thriving in India; and

(g) if so, the reasons for not being ready to challenge China?

## उत्तर ANSWER वस्त्र राज्य मंत्री (**श्रीमती दर्शना जरदोश**) THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR TEXTILES (SMT. DARSHANA JARDOSH)

(a) & (b): India has a considerable share of manmade fibre (MMF) products (fibre, yarn, fabrics, made-ups, readymade garments of MMF) in the total Textiles & Apparel (incl. handicrafts) exports.

(c): Under the PLI Scheme for Textiles focusing on MMF Apparel, MMF Fabrics & Technical Textiles, 64 selected applicants are expected to set up 84 units in 14 states and 1 UT including one in Odisha & 10 in Maharashtra.

(d) & (e): The Government has extended the date of inviting fresh applications through online portal under PLI Scheme for Textiles upto  $31^{st}$  December 2023 and applications are currently being received.

(f) & (g): The industry is gearing up to tap the potential of MMF and Technical Textiles segment, which is a sunrise industry segment in the country duly supported by PLI Scheme for Textiles and National Technical Textiles Mission.

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
