(a) to (d) The Amrit Bharat Station Scheme has been launched for development of Railway stations on Indian Railways. This scheme envisages development of stations on a continuous basis with a long-term approach. Under the Scheme, 1309 stations across the Country, including 72 stations in the State of Andhra Pradesh, have been identified for upgradation/modernisation over Indian Railways.

The scheme involves preparation of Master Plans and their implementation in phases to improve the amenities at the stations including amenities for Divyangjans such as provision of ramp to the station, lifts, divyangjan friendly toilets, drinking water booths, etc.
