AIRPORTS UNDER UDAN SCHEME

100. SHRI SUDHEER GUPTA SHRI DHAIRYASHEEL SAMBHAJIRAO MANE Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION

be pleased to state:-

- (a) the details of the Airports being identified and developed under UDAN scheme in the country, particularly in Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh;
- (b) the details of cities/districts proposed to be covered under the announcement made in the Budget 2023-2024 for setting up of fifty new airports across the country to improve regional air connectivity, State-wise;
- (c) the specific measures taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to upgrade the aviation infrastructure in the country, district-wise;
- (d) the details of funds allocated and utilized under UDAN and other schemes to upgrade aviation infrastructure;
- (e) whether the Government has received letters from Members of Parliament for construction of New Airports as per the said Budget announcement; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof along with the steps taken/being taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

STATEMENT IN RESPECT OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 100 REGARDING "AIRPORTS UNDER UDAN SCHEME" TO BE ANSWERED ON 08.02.2024.

- (a) In the state of Maharashtra, 09 airports namely Kolhapur, Jalgaon, Solapur, Amravati, Nanded, Nasik, Ratnagiri, Gondia & Sindhudurg have been identified for revival and to operate RCS flights under the UDAN scheme, out of which, 06 Airports namely Kolhapur, Jalgaon, Nanded, Nasik, Gondia & Sindhudurg have already been operationalised. Development work is in progress at the remaining airports. In the state of Madhya Pradesh, the 04 airports namely Gwalior, Rewa, Datia & Pachmarhi have been identified for developing and to operate RCS flights. Gwalior Airport has already been operationalised under UDAN in 2017. The development of Rewa, Datia airports is underway. The development work for upgradation of Pachmarhi airport has also been awarded.
- (b) With the budgetary support of Rs. 1000 crore, the Government of India has approved the proposal of Revival/Development of 50 more unserved and underserved Airports/Helipads/Water Aerodromes and ALGs (Phase-II) during the period of 03 years i.e. from 01.04.2023 to 31.03.2026. As on 31.01.2024, Rs 644 Crores have been allocated for 33 Aerodromes identified under the phase -II (Annexure I)
- (c) UDAN scheme has been launched in 2016 with the objective of enhancing remote and regional connectivity through expansion of aviation infrastructure in the country. The scheme envisages revival / upgradation of unserved & underserved airports on its identification through valid bid & award to the SAO (Selected Airline Operator) to operate the route connecting the identified airport. Based on their assessment of demand on

particular routes, interested airlines submit their proposals at the time of bidding under UDAN. An airport which is included in the awarded routes of UDAN and requires upgradation/development for commencement of UDAN operations, is developed under the 'Revival of unserved and underserved airports' scheme. As of now, 76 RCS airports, including 2 water aerodromes & 9 heliports (Annexure II) have been operationalized under the UDAN scheme and more than 133 lakhs passengers benefited from the UDAN flights. 21 Greenfield Airports have been identified for development in the country, out of which 12 have been operationalised so far (Annexure III).

(d) Under the scheme for 'Revival and development of airports, heliports and water aerodromes' for making airports operational, in Phase-I of the Scheme, Rs. 4500 Crore was allocated for this purpose out of which Rs. 3985.22 Crore have been utilised so far.
