- (b) whether the Government has taken/proposes to take any steps to allocate more funds to strengthen NHM and make it more effective;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of Community Health Centres (CHCs) and Public Health Centres (PHCs) established under NHM since its inception in West Bengal; and
- (e) the steps taken by the Government to assess the implementation and progress of NHM, along with its present status?

(a) to (e) With the objective of attainment of universal access to equitable, affordable and quality health care services, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare is implementing National Health Mission. Government provides technical and financial support to the States/UTs for improvement in health infrastructure, availability of adequate human resources to health facilities, to improve availability and accessibility to quality health care especially for the underserved and marginalized groups. The details of funds allocated, released and utilized under the National Health Mission (NHM) since inception to the state of West Bengal is as below:

- 1. The above releases relate to Central Govt. Grants & do not include State share contribution.
- 2. Release for the F.Y. 2023-24 is updated up-to 20.01.2024 and is provisional.
- 3. Expenditure includes expenditure against Central Release, State release & unspent balances at the beginning of the year. Expenditure is as per FMRs submitted by States/UTs. The expenditure w.r.t. flexible pool for RCH, etc. is updated up-to 30.11.2023 and is provisional.
- 4. There is no relevance of allocation after the closure of the financial year.

Central release to the State of West Bengal has increased by 12.24% from FY 2014-15 to FY 2022-23.

Further, as per RHS 2021-22 a total of 348 Community Health Centres (CHCs) and 1,371 Primary Health Centres (PHCs) are functioning in rural and urban areas in the State of West Bengal as on 31st March, 2022.

Under NHM, regular interactions are held with States/UTs. Various mechanisms exist to assess the implementation and progress of NHM like:

- Review of key deliverables of Record of Proceedings of previous financial year during the NPCC meetings,
- Implementation of Public Financial Management System for monitoring and management of funds.
- Release of subsequent instalments is done on the basis of compliance of guidelines of Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance
- Audit:
 - o Performance Audit by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India
 - Annual Statutory Audit- Annual Statutory Audit by Chartered Accountant firms empaneled with C&AG and eligible for conducting audit of major PSUs, and
 - o Concurrent Audit by Chartered Accountant Audit firms.
- Submission of Financial Monitoring Reports (FMRs) by the States/UTs,

Further, monitoring and evaluation of the progress of all states/ UTs is through review meetings, video conferences & field visits of senior officials, promoting performance by setting up benchmarks for service delivery & rewarding achievements etc. The working of National Health Mission (NHM) has been through external surveys such as, National Family Health Survey (NFHS) and Sample Registration System (SRS). The present status of progress under NHM is at Annexure-I. Further, under NHM, Common Review Missions (CRM) are conducted periodically to monitor the progress and implementation status of various schemes. The key strategies and priority areas of CRM is to analyze challenges with respect to strengthening health systems, identify trends in progress of key indicators, evaluate the readiness of the state to undertake implementation of new initiatives, and review the progress and coordination mechanisms with various partners.
