PASSENGER SHIP FROM MANGALORE TO LAKSHADWEEP

1166. SHRI NALIN KUMAR KATEEL:

Will the Minister of PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS be please to state: पत्तन,पोत परिवहन और जलमार्ग मंत्री

- (a) whether the Government was operating a Passenger Ship from Mangalore Old Port to Kadmatt Island, Lakshadweep since March 2020 onwards;
- (b) if so, whether the said service has been discontinued;
- (c) if so, whether the Government has any proposal to resume the operations and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefore; and
- (d) the distance between Mangalore and Kadmatt Island?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

- (a) Yes, Union Territory of LakshadweepAdministration was operating Passenger Ship from Mangalore Old Port to Kadmat island, Lakshadweep.
- (b) Yes, the service of Passenger Ship was discontinued.
- (c) Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between Union Territory of Lakshadweep Administration and Karnataka Maritime Board for implementation of the project of 'Development of dedicated jetty for Lakshadweep with allied infrastructure facilities for cargo and cruise terminal at Old Mangalore Port'. These facilities willfacilitate shipping service between Mangalore port and Lakshadweep islands especially northern group of islands like Amini, Kadmat, Kiltan, Chetlat, Bitra. Government of Karnataka is also planning to operationalise passenger cruise between Mangalore and Lakshadweep Island.
- (d) The distance between Mangalore and Kadmat island is 155 Nautical miles.
