Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has introduced any new scheme for Special Assistance to the States for Capital Expenditure/Investment;
- (b) if so, the details of the interest-free loan/assistance provided to the States so far under the said scheme, State/year-wise including West Bengal, Bihar and Haryana; and
- (c) the details of additional steps taken or being taken by the Government for the capital expenditure/investment in the country?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FINANCE (SHRI PANKAJ CHAUDHARY)

- (a) and (b): Yes Sir. The 'Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure' was launched in the financial year 2020-21 and was continued in 2021-22. Thereafter, the Scheme was implemented as the 'Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment' in the financial years 2022-23 and 2023-24. The State-wise and year-wise details of Special Assistance (Loan) provided under the Schemes to the States including the States of West Bengal, Bihar and Haryana is provided in Annexure.
- (c): The 'Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment 2023-24' is aimed at boosting capital expenditure by the States. Further, the scheme guidelines, inter-alia, stipulate target for capital expenditure for each State for the financial year 2023-24 to be achieved by the States from their own resources for availing the 2nd installment under Part-I (Untied) of the Scheme for 2023-24.
