CENTRAL ASSISTANCE FOR LABOUR RELATED SCHEMES

454. SHRI G.M. SIDDESHWAR:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Central Assistance to the States including Karnataka under various Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) for labours during the last five years and the current year, year-wise and scheme-wise;
- (b) the number of labourers who got benefited from the above schemes during the said period; and
- (c) the details of assistance provided by the Government to State

 Governments to improve the condition of labourers in the country?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI RAMESWAR TELI)

(a) to (c): Ministry of Labour and Employment has been implementing two Centrally Sponsored Scheme namely National Career Service (NCS) and Coaching and Guidance for SC/ST and Other Backward Classes. The central assistance to the States/UTs is provided under the NCS scheme only. Under NCS Scheme, assistance is provided to State/UT government for establishment of Model Career Centres (MCCs) to provide career related services like job search & matching, career counselling, vocational guidance etc. to the jobseekers. So far, 14 MCCs have been approved in Karnataka. From the current financial year 2023-24, the NCS scheme has been categorized as Central Sector Scheme. Funds are released to States/UTs against their proposals for establishment of MCC under the NCS scheme. Details of the funds released to State/UTs (including Karnataka) under NCS scheme during last five years and current year are as under:
